





- 5-year collaborative work plan
- Aligned with:
 - Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement (2012), between US & Canada
 - Ontario's Great Lakes
 Strategy (2012)
 - Ontario's Draft
 Made-in-Ontario
 Environment Plan (2018)
- Funding mechanism for programs/projects



Key messages re Draft COA:

- Ambitious goals
 - time-bound and measurable
- Adequate investment
 - \$100 Million per year
- Accountability measures
 - including commitment to transparent reporting of implementation
